

### **Executive Board Reports.**

Vice President. Andrew Goodman verbally reported on the following items.

- Judges list – be sure to send a qualified judge for horsemanship.
- 25 years of royalty will culminate November 12<sup>th</sup> at Sammy's Showroom at Harrah's.
- Will submit a rule change to move the 30-day deadline up to 60 days.

Andrew then moved to remove Sally West (a.k.a. Sal Clemente, CGRA) from the current royalty team. Following discussion, the motion passed by a voice vote.

Secretary. Larry Lindstrom submitted a written report.

Treasurer. David Hill gave an updated A/R report on what associations still owe for what items.

A 10–minute break was taken at 1:50 pm.

Internet Technology. Frank Harrell demonstrated a “checkout system” of the IGRA handbook he is developing to be used at Annual Convention.

Rodeo Rules. Ty Teigen announced that proposed rule changes would be available soon.

World Gay Rodeo Finals. Brian Rogers reported that the committee had met earlier in the day. Brian moved to approve the dates of October 21–23, 2011 at either resort (in Nevada). Two sets of dates were listed in the original proposal. The motion passed by a voice vote.

Brian also noted that we need to work on scheduling Finals Rodeo first before Annual Convention is decided because of the current 17–day rule.

A 10–minute break was taken at 2:50 pm.

## **New Business.**

University 2011. The dates are January 13–15, 2011 at the Crowne Plaza hotel in St. Louis. The room rate is \$89, which includes a \$10 food/beverage voucher per room. IGRA is looking for additional leadership to assist with University, preferably people with an education background. University is looking to add new classes and instructors. A link to book will be available soon.

MIGRA thanked everyone for coming to their rodeo, the first one in 6 years.


GWGRA thanked everyone for attending their “mud pit” and is looking forward to University.

Rodeo events sanctioned by the International Gay Rodeo Association (IGRA) operate under modified rules of professional and non-gay rodeo while preserving GLBT participation in this North American tradition. Although consisting of traditional rodeo events such as bull riding and bronc riding, gay rodeo activities have purposefully been tailored to provide the animal and human participants with the safest environment possible, while still demonstrating the skill of the contestant.

IGRA uses stock animals in the sport of rodeo. Our position is that this responsible use of stock does not rise to the level of abuse. IGRA does not abuse animals nor condone animal abuse at any time, in any way, by anyone.

The IGRA imposes specified rules related to animal welfare, which are strictly enforced. The association penalizes any contestant, official, or contractor found to be treating any animals inhumanely.

- The minimum penalty for contestants is immediate disqualification from further competition.
- IGRA certified officials are routinely evaluated by IGRA committee chairs and educated regarding IGRA animal use policies.
- Stock contractors are informed of our policies and bylaws related to animal welfare and may suffer financial penalties for failure to comply.

Specific IGRA animal use guidelines include:

- IGRA prohibits the use electric prods in bucking chutes.
- Spur rowels in riding events have event-specific requirements.
- A fleece flank strap is used for bucking events and is not painful to animals in any way.
- Goats participating in the IGRA-specific event “Goat Dressing” are of a minimal height and rested after every 8 “dressings.”
- Arenas are groomed and leveled for maximum horse safety during the speed events.
- An animal advocate committee is assigned by the association to monitor, report, and advocate for the stock animals.
- We prohibit the use of lame, sore, sick, or undersized stock in any event at any time.
- A large animal veterinarian must be on site from the start to the finish of every rodeo. IGRA, therefore, mandates the availability of veterinary care for the animal participants in our rodeos.
- IGRA directs the release of any animal from competition that appears to be in danger of injuring itself.

Our association has an international-level Animal Issues Committee of LGBT cowboys and cowgirls that tracks issues related to animal use, annually reviews our animal use and welfare policies, and reports directly to the annual convention.

ALL IGRA members, contestants, certified officials, and volunteers are educated on and responsible for the implementation of these animal welfare policies at our member association rodeos and at the IGRA-produced World Gay Rodeo Finals.



Rodeo Variance Approvals. Brian Rogers wanted contestant registration to be 2 hours from 6-8 pm at finals. The Trustees did not feel this was possible since it states in Rodeo Rules that registration will be for 3 hours.

Certification Requests. FGRA member Jim Mitchell has completed the Chute Coordinator certification program and that committee approved his certification. The recommendation passed by a voice vote.

New Business. Dee Zuspahn asked why a contestant in Chicago was allowed to compete with a leg cast when the rule states long-sleeve shirt, Western hat, and boot. In the past, contestants have been allowed to compete with casts as long as they are covered and well protected.

Trustee Checklist. This document, originally written for new Trustees, needs to be updated and put back on the Web site. At convention, the Trustees will decide whether to move the pre-rodeo meeting back to 5:45 pm – 15 minutes prior to the start of contestant registration.

Linda Frazier asked for a show of hands on which associations refunded the late fee. The result appeared to be 50–50.

Peter Calabrese commented that when doing the rodeo checklist several times this year, certain stock contractors used excessive prodding on their animals. While never in the chutes, it is still visible.

Checklist Trustee. John Beck and Phil Lister volunteered to do the rodeo checklist.

Protest Trustee. Bill Chapman volunteered to do the protest duties.

Evaluation Forms. Linda Frazier volunteered to distribute the certified officials evaluation forms.

Secretary's Report

International Awards. In my last report, I stated that nominations for the international awards would be accepted through the end of the board meeting on Friday. If there are more than 5 nominations per award, I will put them on a ballot via the [IGRABOD] group and set the voting deadline 30 days after. I have copied the description for each of the following 2 awards.

Section 5. International Award. This award is to recognize those members of IGRA who have made contributions to IGRA worthy of special recognition. This contribution can be in any of the activities that IGRA encompasses. The Board of Directors selects the recipients of this award. IGRA will cover the cost of no more than five (5) awards.

Section 6. Trustees' Award. This award is to recognize those contestants of IGRA who have exhibited excellence in the standards exemplified in the Code of Ethics and Sportsmanship. The Trustees select the recipients of this award. IGRA will cover the cost of no more than five (5) awards.

Appreciation Awards. Submissions will be accepted up through October 1<sup>st</sup>. A reminder that these awards are intended for **non-members**.

Section 8. Appreciation Award. This award is for non-members of IGRA who have made significant contributions to the association and is a means of providing a formal "thank you." This award may be given by the Officers, Directors, Trustees, Committee Chairs, or other official representatives of IGRA with the approval of the Board of Directors. IGRA will cover the cost of no more than two (2) awards per Member Association.


2010 Membership Renewals. Tuesday, September 14<sup>th</sup> is the 60-day cutoff date for Annual Convention. This means that all bylaw, standing rule, and rodeo rule changes need to be in to their respective chairs in **11 days**. This is also the date that all Member Association renewals are due to me. I have completed renewals from TGRA, DSRA, NGRA, and HSRA.

2011 Rodeo Approvals. Rodeos to be held after May 11, 2011 must be approved at convention in Reno. Please have your applications to me by November 4<sup>th</sup>.

Section 7. Rodeos shall be sanctioned by the Board of Directors. A majority vote of the board will be required to sanction a rodeo. Sanctioning of a rodeo must occur:

- A. At least six (6) months prior to the planned rodeo date, AND
- B. Before the beginning of the prior year's annual convention.
- C. Rodeo application must be approved at a regularly scheduled board meeting.
- D. Rodeo application must be available for review no less than 7 days prior to sanctioning.

And finally, please submit your alternates to the IGRABOD group prior to all upcoming rodeos and board meetings.
