IGRA Board of Directors

August 21, 2026

10:00 AM

Santa Fe, NM

The meeting was called to order at 10:00am by President Brian Helander. Secretary Gene Fraikes conducted the roll call and a quorum was present. See attached.

A motion was made by Chuck Browning and seconded to approve the minutes from the April 24, 2026(2nd Qtr) as emailed 05/06/26 and the minutes from June 10, 2026(SPL_Zoom) as emailed 6/11/26. Motion passed.

OFFICER REPORTS

President Brian Helander gave a verbal report of the state of the organization.

Secretary Gene Fraikes read a written report. See attached.

Tim Smith read a note to Trustees from the Executive Director Tommy Channel. Tommy wanted everyone to know that they will be doing a bid for rodeo liability insurance in the near future. Please let him know if you know anyone to send the bid to for a quote. The bid will go out after convention. Also, if anyone has any idea how to distribute the cost to associations. Also what things should be considered such as liquor liability. Discussion was held concerning this distribution. President Brian Helander assigned a working group of David Hill, Michael Lentz, Tim Smith and Tommy Channel to look at the distribution process for 2027 and report.

Brian Helander advised that he has ask Alex Stokes to get full control over Gayrodeohistory.org from Frank Harrel. The admin powers have been transferred to Alex Stokes at this time.

Treasurer David Hill reported that the financials are on website and asked if anyone had any questions. David advised he has started putting money into CD's and the interest has gone up accordingly. David advised that some associations have not paid their insurance and some have already had their rodeo. UGRA, MIGRA, NSGRA are the associations with insurance payments past due. Chuck Browning advised that he was concerned that the cash flow from royalty fundraisers is not being properly documented. David Hill is going to send out a reminder with the proper form. There was extensive discussion around financial controls identifying possible missing processes. There was a recommendation of a working group to develop financial controls needed along with updating bylaws of missing requirements. President established the working group with Ed Barry, Michael Lentz, David Hill, Chuck Browning, Chris Tobin and Jeffrey Neal.



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David Hill reported on the PayPal recovery process & security issue. The original number of \$35,000 was taken and we have got back \$28,000. PayPal is dragging their feet on the balance at this time.

David Hill advised that the Corporate Auditors Report was emailed out and then asked for any questions. There were some questions concerning the uncashed checks mentioned in the auditor's report. David Hill advised that all these checks were from 2025 and he was working to get these checks cashed or reissued and cashed.

Gene Fraikes advised that he felt that we should look at what is posted on the website for public view as well as what and how we restrict other information. President Helander made the statement that he would like to assign a committee to look at what should be public and what should be private. Gene Fraikes will chair this group, and the members will be Chuck Browning and Chris Tobin.



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External Audit Update

Brain Helander reminded us that we already approved \$5000 for this but we plan to move this until a later date to be able to prepare for this.

Brian Helander asked if any association was going to be making a presentation at Convention this year to host the 2028 Convention. Brian reminded us that if nobody gives a presentation at convention IGRA will pick the location.

NGRA Big Horn Rodeo May 28-30

Motion by Chris Tobin and second by Chuck Browning to sanction all 3. There was concern voiced with the variances for the NGRA rodeo. Chuck Browning moved and was seconded to amend the motion to read only approve the TGRA and GSGRA-PS rodeo and to pull NGRA's application for discussion. Motion Carried

Motion by Michael Lentz and second by Steve Housley to approve the NGRA rodeo with the correction of the variance that allowed the tractor in the arena for Barrels and poles instead of barrels and flags. Concern was voiced on the variance concerning raking. Hand count was called for. All in favor 7, all apposed 8 motion failed.

Motion was made by Michael to sanction the NGRA application with the editorial change of barrels and poles instead of barrels and flags denying the variance for dragging denied.

Motion passed.

Gene Fraikes passed around examples of the new Royalty logo embroidery done by Twisted Embroidery for review. Motion was made by Tim Smith and second by Michael Lentz to allow the use of this logo for embroidery by Twisted Embroidery. Due to the authority to authorize use comes from the Marketing Committee this motion was ruled out of order. It was recommended that the Marketing committee re-evaluate their previous concerns.

Guy Puglisi received and read written report from Vice President Kami Boles, see attached. Tim Smith made a motion and second by Steven Housley to instruct the VP to correct the Royalty Contest judge draw. Motion passed. Guy Puglisi advised that he would get with Kami and help get this done.



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Jeffrey Neal gave an overview of what having a University at the Horseshoe Casino might look like based on what our costs might be. Jeffrey reported that the university group felt it was important to have an educational event. Discussion ensued. Tim Smith moved to approve the \$1200 budget for the dance and second by Michael Lentz. Motion passed. During the discussion it was identified that it is going to take help from the board and members to put on the dance. Without University that weekend that could be a challenge. Chris Tobin advised during the discussion that he was working on 3 different non rodeo sports related teams to be there to participate in the Sin City Classic. This would give a small pool of people to draw from for help with the dance event.

Called back to order at 2:48pm

RMS System (David Hill/Guy Puglisi) Guy gave a verbal report that Robin Walker was going to be at Santa Fe rodeo to review additional requirements for RMS.

Gene Fraikes asked Chuck Browning if he could explain more concerning our contract with Cultural Sponge concerning the IGRA.COM and gay-rodeo.net websites. Chuck advised that although the original contract was set up to bring all the websites under one umbrella, it was determined that was not the best thing to do since Alexander Saites had done such a good job with IGRA.COM. Chuck advised that Cultural Sponge was working on connectivity between gay-rodeo.net and IGRA.COM. When asked when the work may be completed Chuck advised that would be as soon as he could get Scott Korff and Cultural Sponge together at the same time to work out the details of implementation.

INTERNATIONAL AWARDS:

Secretary Gene Fraikes advised that there was only one nomination for WGRF Community Hero. Robert Thurtell moved to vote on Community Hero Robert Garza as WGRF Community Hero by acclamation. Second by Dane Henzel. Motion passed.

Secretary Gene Fraikes advised that the Media award was based on the recommendation of the Public Relations Committee and there was only one name presented. Motion was made and seconded to accept FGRA as the winner of the 2026 Media award. Motion passed.

Secretary Gene Fraikes advised there were no nominations for Honorary Grand Marshal.



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Secretary Gene Fraikes distributed ballots for the following awards. Ballots were collected and counted. Tally sheets are attached with the exception of the Wayne Jakino Award. It was decided without objection that the winner will remain secret until awarded at WGRF. Tally sheet for this award is on file with the Secretary.

Secretary Report

August 21, 2026

The due date for receiving applications for association membership renewals is October 21, 2026. Please refer to Bylaw Article IV section 6 for the information that you need to include.

The due date for receiving your rodeo applications for 2027 is November 4, 2026. This is the day before the due date that they must be distributed to the BOD for review so if you are late it will be too late based on our Bylaws/Standing Rules.

We have continued to clean up old and missing data on IGRA.COM. There is only 1 item currently on the outstanding list. That item is the bios for the 2026 IGRA Royalty Team. These have been requested from the team many times and are having trouble getting them submitted. If anyone sees anything missing or no longer needed on IGRA.COM please reach out to me and I'll do what I can to make it current.

As a part of getting current data on IGRA.COM you should have noticed that I have now started uploading Minutes, surveys as well as rodeo applications to the allocated areas of IGRA.COM. I'm not sure where they are is where they really should be but they are there. A couple questions that have come up for me in doing this is what exact documents should we be storing on IGRA.COM and where should they be stored? Do we need two different secure sections?

The President and myself have talked a couple times about using technology to capture the details for minutes of our meetings as well as on the convention floor. I have researched this to the best of my ability and found NOTHING that would not involve buying an extensive amount of recording equipment. There are lots of options for recording ONLINE meetings and such but to record an in person open meeting would require microphones for the entire room as well as recording equipment such as sound boards to control all the mics. I don't know if it's practical to require each table at convention

to have a laptop connected to a zoom meeting so that recording could happen though that. That's the only thing I could think of to be able to record the activity on the convention floor.

I have been asked a couple different times for a list of people who have received different awards. I do not have any such lists. Should the Secretary have and maintain lists like this? How would we be able to obtain a starting list. As I stated, I currently have nothing but my memory of some of the awards from the past 3 years or so.

Finally, between now and convention is a very busy time of the year for me as Secretary. I have many different things that have to be taken care of before the opening of convention. With that said, please monitor your email on a somewhat regular basis for emails from me giving you information as well as asking for information I need from you. Please do all you can to respond to my requests as quickly as possible as I am waiting on that response to be able to complete my tasks.

IGRA Corporate Auditor Report for IGRA BOD Meeting at Santa Fe, NM
August 21, 2026

REPORT Covering April through July 2026 – Four Months Reviewed:

- I reviewed Apr through Jul 2026
- I had full access to the books and records and related reconciliations that were available of IGRA via Quickbooks On-Line and details sent to me by David via email.
- I reviewed the Apr through Jul 2026 Bank Reconciliations. The three bank accounts and CD all reconciled and agreed to the General Ledger, I reviewed the Online Reconciliation Reports and the Bank Statements.
- I reviewed the Income Statements and Balance Sheets for all four months. The Income on the Balance Sheets agrees to the Income on the Income Statements and Retained Earnings rolled forward appropriately.

Details:

- I reviewed the General Ledger for deposit, expense transactions, and various prepaid items and Undeposited funds (in-Transit) from Apr through Jul 2026
- There were 269 line items in the overall sample. (some deposits/expenditures covered multiple lines of detail)
- See ending footnotes for sample size and methodology, which I adjusted for this period.
- Using a random number generator (found at random.org) I ran a random sample covering 22.3% of deposits/expenditures – 60 items in the reviewed period. This is still roughly double the basic norm but was intentional to have a higher standard of assurance.
- All of the deposits examined tied to the general ledger as did the expenditures in the sample of 60.
- All expenditure support conforms to the IRS Publication 463 rules on receipt limits, except one as noted below but it's below the lowest threshold.
- See the following notes:
 - 1 April - 13 checks, 6 are over 6 months old out of 13 uncleared. May 7 of 7, June 7 of 7, July 7 of 13, but always the same ones, clearly they need to be reissued or see if they will donate it back, which is allowed. David will be following up.
 - 2 Otherwise, set up "Unclaimed Property Liability" or "Stale Checks Liability." for the stale dated checks, try to get them cleared, none meet the 3-year mark for remittance to the State of CO yet in the escheatment process. Should no resolution happen in 3 years' time we will need to remit to the State of Colorado.
 - 3 Mike Lentz has extended Electronically and has the written response for extending the 990 until November 15th 2026 for the prior year.
 - 4 I see no more Fraudulent transactions since February 2026 from electronic transactions. David let me know that Paypal took \$35,538.65 out and his work with Experian and US Bank recovered \$29,430.33 leaving \$6,108.22 that he is trying to recover. Besides the recommendations from my last report if IGRA does not have Tech E&O/Cybercrime coverage, given that most of the IGRA level financial work is electronic I would recommend obtaining it. If we have it recovering under that may be an option.
 - 5 Mike Lentz and I to discuss CPA financial Audit Questions at Mike's availability
 - 6 1 of 60 transactions where ownership of the Subscription is not clear, if loaning to IGRA a personal plan, wonderful, but if required software it probably should be in IGRA's name. IGRA Admin. Asst. & Treasurers laptops, 100% business deduction. There is no pressing need to change this arrangement by the way. It's treated like a reimbursable and they are IGRA owned computers.

Unusual items:

- Open item from last reported and noted above, the PayPal issue, it's turned off. Final resolution may take a while.

Additional items to note, (recap):

- I've recommended to David (prior report) possibly adding the Square Stmt. to the system, but they currently show up on the bank statements, so it's really optional but more complete and for the Travel Stipend to paste in the standard IGRA policy just for IRS Audit purposes. Again, optional and he is aware of it.

I am happy to report to the IGRA Board of Directors that nothing out of the ordinary, except the very minor issue noted, have come up.

I would like to thank our Treasurer, David Hill for his continued excellent work.

Please note: This is an Internal Review/Audit, as prescribed by the By-Laws and is not, nor is it intended to be, an external independent audit performed in accordance with Generally Accepted Auditing Standards and accordingly no opinion is expressed on the IGRA financial statements in that respect.

IGRA Alumni Committees Goals, Strategies Report Prepared for the IGRA Board Meeting and Convention floor— 11/24/2026
Prepared by: IGRA Alumni Committee Chair Mark Arnold

1. Executive summary

- Since the last board meeting, the Alumni Committee has advanced alumni engagement, developing and strengthening partnerships with other LGBTQ+ sports community's around the country. Developing IGRA University programming along with the IGRA Royalty Rodeo programs, also Alumni continues in its mission in the development of IGRA mission of fund raising with the WGRF initiative, Capitol Campaign and the 5-year strategic plan, we have prepared the materials for the capital campaign release and presentation. Activities have focused on ambassadors for mobilization, communications, fundraising readiness, and alignment with institutional implementation of strategy of growth.

1. Alumni engagement & activities

- Events: Organized many Alumni mixers and two virtual panels featuring IGRA University members and recent donors. (Total attendance ~20).
 - Mentorship program: working on a pilot mentor-mentee cohort (20 mentors/40 mentees) connecting alumni to current LGBTQ+ for future board members and fundraising career guidance, Partnerships, internships, and project support.
 - Communications: are about to Roll out a quarterly alumni newsletter along with creating an alumni portal with an events calendar, volunteer sign-up and giving options Season 2 of the IGRA podcast, and Filming has begun for future webinar series this brings us into the virtual world.
 - University Volunteer mobilization: Created an alumni volunteer roster to support fundraising efforts with events, regional rodeos, and membership recruitment outreach program.
1. Partnerships with IGRA University programming and the GLRHF Pride Sports UK along with Compete Sports Network
- Curriculum support: Alumni subject-matter experts contributed to guest lectures and two curriculum review sessions to align programming with 501 c3 none profit needs for Association and IGRA board training.
 - Internship pipeline: Formalized a process for alumni-hosted internships; three pilot internships with leading University are confirmed for summer 2027.

- Sponsorship: Secured commitments from alumni donors for two named Legacy Wall Members for The Capitol Campaign in the amount of \$10,000 starting Fall 2026–27.

1. Collaboration with IGRA Royalty Rodeo program

- Operational support: Alumni volunteers assisting with logistics, judging, and publicity for the upcoming Rodeo year, improving participant experience and reducing event costs to finals and ensuring adequate facility for the IGRA rodeo royalty completion Thru Alumni Donor Funds.
- Fundraising & promotion: Alumni channels amplified Rodeo sponsorship outreach, resulting in new corporate sponsors and a large increase in Rodeo-related donations.
- Leadership development: Rodeo alumni engaged in coaching sessions for contestants, strengthening contestant pipelines into broader IGRA leadership roles.

1. Contribution to the 5-year strategic plan

- Working group participation: Committee members served on the Strategic Plan Steering Committee and provided alumni perspectives on 501 c3 workforce, lifelong learning, and strategic planning for the future potential.
- Priority alignment: Recommended strategic initiatives incorporated into draft plan include: expanded IGRA workforce programs, a structured giving programs, and a scalable mentorship/accelerator model.
- Deliverables: Engaging a consolidated IGRA action plan and KPI recommendations (engagement rate, mentorship placements, annual alumni giving) to strategy authors; these are included in the draft plan for Future Board review.

1. Capital campaign presentation & readiness

- Case development: Collaborated with development team to draft alumni-focused case statements highlighting a Legacy fund, and endowment priorities.
- Prospect identification: Mapped high-capacity alumni ambassadorship and affinity groups; produced a prioritized stewardship list (top 75 prospects) for campaign cultivation.
- Materials & staffing: Preparing slides deck and a 20 pager for Board presentation; recommended volunteer campaign co-chairs from the alumni network and to train 6 alumni as campaign ambassadors.
- Financial target alignment: Alumni commitments and projected leads currently account for approximately 18–22% of initial campaign engagement target; additional cultivation needed to reach pledge goals.

1. Challenges and gaps

- Data integration: Alumni records need consolidation for more effective prospecting and segmentation.
- Capacity: Volunteer coordinator role remains unfilled part-time; scaling alumni initiatives will require dedicated volunteer staffing and budget.
- Engagement consistency: Geographic dispersion limits participation in in-person activities—virtual program enhancements are required.

1. Recommendations for Board action

- Approve a Position for Volunteer Coordinator to fulfill and support mentorship, campaign activation, and partnership coordination.
- Endorse the alumni contributions and recommended KPIs within the 5-year strategic plan.
- Approve Board-level allocation for targeted alumni data integration (CRM enhancement) to support the capital campaign and prospect tracking.
- Ratify the recommended alumni campaign co-chairs and authorize immediate cultivation outreach to the top 75 prospect list.

1. Next steps

- Finalizing the presentation for the alumni section in the capital campaign pitch to be presented at a future board meeting 2026 2027.
- Begin prioritized prospect outreach upon Board approval of campaign co-chairs and staffing.
- Complete CRM integration plan and timeline within 60 days.
- Launch expanded virtual alumni programming to increase engagement outside major hubs.

Third Quarter Board Meeting

Royalty Team Requirements

Going into the third quarter, six of our thirteen Royalty members have completed all requirements for their sash. Those members include Tanya Owen, Anna Conda, Ryder Gently, Bobby Cat, and Devina Ross.

The remaining members are actively working toward completing their requirements. I have spoken with each of them, and they either have a fundraising event already scheduled or are currently working to raise the remaining funds needed to meet their minimum requirements.

All but one member has confirmed that they anticipate completing their requirements by the end of September. I am providing the Board with this update so everyone has a clear understanding of where the team currently stands as we move closer to Finals.

Following this weekend, all thirteen Royalty members will have met their rodeo attendance requirements, and at this time, all thirteen plan to attend Finals and participate in their step-down.

Finals Horse Contestant Fundraiser

In conjunction with individual Royalty members working toward their fundraising minimums, the Royalty team is continuing to host an online fundraiser to help offset the cost of bedding for the horse contestants at Finals.

If you see the fundraiser advertisement on Facebook, please feel free to share it. As long as participants comment on the original post, those comments will come back to me, and I can update the form and squares as needed.

Currently, Venmo is the only payment method being used, and payments are coming directly to me. This allows me to see the notes attached to each payment and properly track who purchased each square. If anyone has a better suggestion for collecting and tracking payments for this type of fundraiser, I am absolutely open to ideas.

Royalty Competition and Finals

Going into Finals, Michael Vrooman has spearheaded the Royalty Competition preparations, and everything is moving forward on schedule.

If we have a Horsemanship Competition this year, it will be held Friday at 5:00 p.m. at the arena. Associations responsible for providing a judge for Horsemanship will receive additional information closer to Finals once we know whether we will have contestants participating in that category.

All other Royalty Competition events are currently planned to begin at 7:00 p.m. each evening.

This year, all Royalty events will be held at the arena, eliminating the need to travel back and forth between the arena and hotels. Everything will be in-house for the weekend, which should make the competition much easier for contestants, judges, volunteers, and attendees.

Michael Brent has been confirmed as the DJ for the weekend, and Frank Thompson has once again agreed to create the flower bouquets for the competition. The competition buckles and sashes have also been ordered. And there's a fundraiser being hosted in Arizona this month to help offset the cost of the sashes.

Anniversary Recognition

We have several significant Royalty anniversaries to recognize this year:

I also reached out to the 40-year anniversary recipients I was able to locate. Unfortunately, those I contacted are currently unable to attend Finals. Royalty Awards, Sashes, and Logo

The Royalty buckles and sashes have been ordered, and the crowns are already in our possession.

We are also working on the updated Royalty logo and determining the best way to incorporate it into the sashes moving forward. We are exploring both embroidery and having the logo produced as a patch, which could eliminate some of the challenges and costs associated with embroidery in the future.

We are currently waiting on quotes before making a final decision.

Other than those remaining details, everything for the Royalty Competition is currently on track for Finals.

Judges

The judges' draw was sent out a few weeks ago. I have received responses from some associations regarding who they will be sending as their judge.

Closing

Sin City Classic Dance Committee Report

IGRA Board of Directors Meeting

Santa Fe, NM – August 21, 2026

Committee Members: Roger Bergmann, Brian Helander as Ex-Officio

Last Committee Meeting: Phone calls and emails

January 15 & 16, 2027:

Jason Peplinski reached out to Brian Helander to propose that IGRA collaborate with the Sin City Classic (SCC) organization to produce dance events at the 2027 SCC. Brian asked me to work with Jason to see if we can make this happen.

I have had two phone calls and several email contacts with Jason and have visited the Horseshoe Hotel & Casino twice. This is where things stand at this moment:

SCC has several events going on throughout the weekend, and they want to avoid conflicting events as much as possible. Line dance lessons will take place on Friday afternoon from 2:00 to 4:00. And will be free. This will take place in Skyview Ballrooms 5 and 6, which will be open as one ballroom for the entire weekend. These two combined rooms are larger than all three rooms that we used at WGRF 2025. The line dance lessons will need to take place on carpeting, as that ballroom will have many tables and chairs setup for Friday evening's "*Ru Paul Viewing Party*".

The dance floor will be setup on Saturday morning, and the dance will be from 8:00 pm to Midnite. SCC already has scheduled bartenders for 4-hour shifts, so they will take care of the bartenders. The dance will end at Midnite because many of the SCC attendees will have sporting events to go to on Sunday morning.

SCC has the contract with the Horseshoe Hotel & Casino and already has the ballroom reserved and has discounts available for the dance floor. Jason has told me that SCC will pay for the dance floor. He does not have an exact dollar figure yet, but expects it to be around \$7,000 to \$8,000, including setup and teardown.

SCC is expecting IGRA to cover the expenses for a DJ/Dance Instructor. I have contacted Ingu Yun in San Francisco, and he has agreed that he can do this, but he expects his airfare and hotel room to be covered. Right now, Southwest flights will be about \$375 round trip. Jason told me that all their comp rooms have already been assigned, but he thinks he can get additional staff rooms at \$100 per night. He has not yet confirmed this with me. So, at this point it appears that the IGRA costs will be approximately \$575, but if there are no discounted room nights the cost could be around \$1,000 plus or minus. I assume that

IGRA will reimburse Ingu Yun for his plane ticket, but IGRA may need to reimburse SCC for the discounted hotel room.

Originally, Jason thought that the sound system built into the walls could be used at no additional expense, but this past week I confirmed that system is only for speaking, not for music, which will be distorted. I assume that SCC will pay for the sound system, but he has not replied to my email. SCC will also need to pay the ASCAP licensing fee.

Jason will need to firm up his expected costs prior to setting the ticket price for the Saturday night dance. He hopes to keep the tickets at \$20 but may need to go to \$25 to cover the expenses. Jason is not expecting to have a lot of excess revenue at the end of the event. The dances will be open to the public to purchase tickets, and SCC will have people at the door to sell tickets.

SCC will be selling the tickets online prior to the weekend. I have suggested that they keep a close eye on ticket sales and increase the size of the dance floor if it appears there will be a larger crowd than expected. Right now, they are hoping for 300 to 350 and are planning on a 30' x 45' dance floor.

IGRA is also expected to provide monitors at the entrance doors to the dance.

Still to be determined:

If the event can be successful in the absence of IGRA members attending an IGRA University and being available to volunteer to help manage the event.

IGRA banners around the dance entrance, and perhaps a gay rodeo archives exhibit, may encourage some of the SCC attendees to get more involved with gay rodeo.

How any excess revenue will be divided between SCC and IGRA, and what will happen if SCC does not make enough to cover all the expenses.

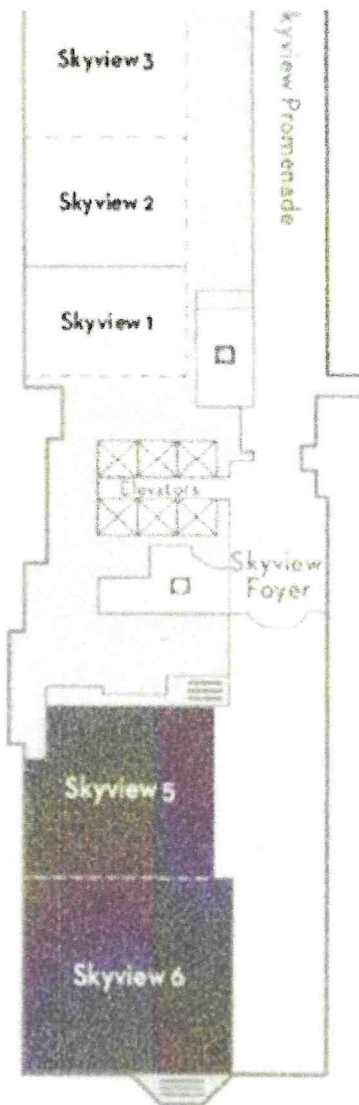
I anticipate the revenue to be minimal if SCC only charges a \$20 entry fee for the dance.

ACTION ITEM: The IGRA Board needs to vote to approve the anticipated expenses for the DJ/Dance Instructor.
